In the present day, the Nakhchivan Autonomous Republic is separated from Azerbaijan's mainland by the Meghri Region. Therefore, the Zangezur Corridor will integrate Nakhchivan into Azerbaijan's political, economic, and social structure by connecting it to Azerbaijan. The corridor will facilitate Nakhchivan's opening to the outside world and participation in regional cooperation, while also strengthening Azerbaijan's territorial integrity.
